

The British Army in Catterick wanted to create a new and updated Urban Training Facility, this was to form part of the current Whinny Hill training area with more traditional infrastructure.

BeaverFit SOE designed, manufactured, and installed a large scale hyper-realistic training village for a defence training estate - operated by Landmark. This concept offers urban exercises and activities, and a simulative training that enables the users and operators to train in true to life and situational environments.

This solution was comprised of multistorey buildings, an Urban Training Tower with Simulated Lift Shaft and Air Delivery Platform, Method of Entry doors and windows, reconfigurable rooms and doors. THIRTEEN SINGLE AND TWO-STOREY
